



### Introduction

Green Spot was originally produced exclusively for the Mitchell family who, commenced trading in 1805 on 10 Grafton St. in the heart of Dublin city as purveyors of fine wines and confectionary. Four generations later, the company is still in the wine and spirits business, under the stewardship of Jonathan Mitchell and his son Robert.

The Mitchell family expanded into whiskey bonding in 1887, whereby they sent empty wine, sherry and port casks via horse and cart to the local Jameson Distillery, which were then filled and returned to the Mitchell's cellar warehouse. There, the whiskeys matured for many years under bond until they were ready to be bottled and sold.

The Green Spot name originated from the Mitchell family's practice of marking casks of different ages with a daub of coloured paint. There was a 'Blue Spot', 'Red Spot' and even a 'Yellow Spot', but Green Spot emerged as their most popular whiskey and is one of the few "whiskey bonder brands" to survive to modern day.

# What is Single Pot Still Irish whiskey?

Single Pot Still whiskey is unique to Ireland. It is regarded as the quintessential style of Irish whiskey, safeguarded and nurtured under the watchful eye of the Midleton Distillery for almost two hundred years. Single Pot Still Irish Whiskey is made from a mash of malted and umalted barley and then triple distilled in traditional copper pot stills. Pot Still Irish whiskeys are characterised by full, complex flavours and a wonderful, creamy mouthfeel.



## Green Spot

Green Spot is a non age statement Single Pot Still Irish whiskey and is comprised of Pot Still whiskeys aged between 7 and 10 years. The whiskey has matured in both ex-bourbon and ex-sherry casks with only a small quantity bottled each year.



## Tasting notes

Nose: Fresh aromatic oils and spices with orchard fruits and barley on a background of toasted wood

Taste: Full spicy body. A hint of cloves along with the fruity sweetness of green apples, rounded off with toasted oak

Finish: Lingering flavours of spices and barley.

Bottled at 40% ABV | Non chill filtered
